INCOMPAS Welcomes MOBILE NOW Act

WASHINGTON DC (Nov 10, 2015) - Today INCOMPAS, the competitive networks association (formerly COMPTTEL), announced its support for the MOBILE NOW Act -- draft legislation led by Chairman John Thune (R-SD).
