INCOMPAS Files Statement of Issues in Net Neutrality Case

WASHINGTON, D.C. (May 29, 2018) – Today, INCOMPAS filed a Statement of Issues in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia (D.C. Circuit) providing detail in its net neutrality challenge to the Federal Communication Commission’s (FCC) Restoring Internet Freedom Order.

The statement outlines how the FCC’s Order abandoned its long-held, bipartisan jurisdiction to ensure an open internet, including the bright-line rules of no blocking, no throttling, no paid prioritization and strong interconnection policies.

As a petitioner in the case, INCOMPAS is taking a leading role in the legal fight to save net neutrality on behalf of its member companies, including streaming services, internet edge providers and fiber broadband network builders.
