## **INCOMPAS: Congress and Courts Will Make FCC Net Neutrality Move Nothing More than a Forgotten Footnote in History**

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (June 11, 2018)** – After two decades of bipartisan net neutrality policy, the FCC will move forward today with a controversial proposal to end open internet protections that benefit consumers, and promote small business competition.

**In response, Chip Pickering, CEO of INCOMPAS, released the following statement:**

“Net neutrality is the main street business issue of the year. After a historic bipartisan vote in the Senate to reverse the FCC, the House must now listen to the 80 percent of Americans who are demanding net neutrality stay on the books.

“Conservative millennials starting small businesses in rural America are scratching their head at policymakers in Washington. Getting rid of net neutrality only helps Comcast and AT&T and hurts everyone else. They want Congress to act now, and make today’s move by the FCC nothing more than a forgotten footnote in history.”
